AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF BURLINGTON,
IN THE COUNTY OF BURLINGTON, STATE OF NEW JERSEY,
PROVIDING FOR THE UTILIZATION OF GENERAL DEVELOPMENT
PLANS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THE
MUNICIPAL LAND USE LAW, N.J.S.A. 40:55D-1 ET SEQ.

Mr. McLernon reported on the very spirited discussion that was held in other room for the past 40 minutes with Representatives of the Masonic Charity Foundation and many residents. The discussion was held on the future plans; layouts and conceptual plans; which there are none, because the action that is needed to drive those and generate those plans is born out of the zoning change that you will be considering tonight. The issues discussed ranged from pastoral settings; to if the Masonic Charity wished to totally liquidate their holdings it would result in a 250 single family home driving children into the school system; as opposed to the CCRC. The Masonic Charity Foundation is portrayed as a reputable organization by witness of the facility they have. The residents have some very specific questions; we tried to advise them that when this gets started it would have to go through the Planning Board.

President Kozub opened the floor to the public.

JOHN SMITH, 1019 JACKSONVILLE ROAD: Mr. Smith stated that Mr. McLernon did a fine job in the back, but stated that he is concerned about the permanent designation of CCRC from single units to townhouses to apartments and in any given times those types of units can change. He stated that once we approve this CCRC it is allowed without even testing the market. He stated that 450 acres is a large area to just change the zoning on, which is probably the last piece of open space left in Burlington Township; with exception of Green Acres Park.

Mr. Smith suggested that maybe we should just see how the market is and look at it every five years before we make such a change. He asked if you have to change every parcel of land in that area.

Mayor George explained to Mr. Smith that the session that was just held in the backroom was strictly for information purposes by the Masonic Home Representatives without any elected officials in the room. He explained that this is now where you raise you questions and your issues to the 7 Elected Councilmen and the Mayor.

Mr. Smith then asked if once the zoning is approved and the CCRC is approved; any one of those particular uses can be moved from area to area and will we be notified.

President Kozub explained that once this goes to the Planning and Zoning Board's you will have the opportunity to express your likes and dislikes of the project in front of the Planning and Zoning Board's.

President Kozub explained that it is not just cut and dry that it is going to be CCRC and you can put it anywhere you want. He stated that the Zoning Board will look at it very carefully so that it matches the integrity of the township; along with our Master Plan and going forward with whatever development we have. He mentioned not to forget that this is a fifteen year plan.

Mr. Hatfield, Assistant Engineer explained that if anything changes everyone within 200 feet will be notified.

JEFFREY WILSON: 1017 JACKSONVILLE ROAD: Mr. Mullen echoed the same concerns that Mr. Smith stated above. He questioned as to if they proceed with certain block and lots and go before the Planning Board won't the people within 200 feet be the only ones notified.

Mr. Hatfield explained that this is something that will have to be reviewed by the Planning Board Solicitor on how the public notification will take place. He explained CCRC ordinance requires that property be development at a minimum of 100 continuous acres; you can't just pick and choose little pieces.

President Kozub asked Mr. Carnivale how many certified notices were sent out.

Mr. Carnivale replied over 500 notices went out to the surrounding communities and the County in two separate mailings.

MICHAEL FARROW: 1003 JACKSONVILLE ROAD: Mr. Farrow questioned as to why the Masonic Home didn't proceed with solar panels.

President Kozub stated that because of the economic factors it was studied and the Engineering Department was in on that study; it wasn't feasible and it wasn't good return on investment.

Mr. Hatfield stated that the Masonic Charity Foundation does intend to move forward with this particular project.

Mr. Farrow explained that he feels that they should finish what they started before they start another.

Mr. Hatfield explained that they have approvals and they are under not obligation to proceed with this project.

JAMES LEROY: 6 LITTLE OXMEAD ROAD: Mr. Leroy questioned if this will increase the use of township services such as water, sewage, police, fire protection and trash pickup.

MARK NATHAM: BURLINGTON BY-PASS: Feels this will change the character of Burlington Township, because it is the last large parcel of land in Burlington Township.

KATHLEEN: 1100 HIGH STREET: Asked if you have to be a Mason in order to use the Masonic Facilities.

ANNIE : 30 MOHR ROAD: She is very disappointed with the loss of a high parcel of farmland and asked what if they flip the property.

JOHN SMITH: 1019 JACKSONVILLE ROAD: Mr. Smith explained that we all care about the township and would like everyone to be notified of any changes.

JOHN GILLESPIE: PARKER AND MCKAY: Mr. Gillespie summarized the intent of the Masonic Home proposal.
